If you would like to attend Friday or Saturday, you need to choose one keynote presentation for the **AM** (10am–11.15am) section and a different one from the **PM** (14.40pm–15.30pm) section.

You then need to choose one workshop from the **Morning** section and a different one from the **Afternoon** section.

For Sunday you need to choose just one keynote presentation and one workshop.
