On one of my last visits to see him shortly before his death, he asked me to pray with him. As I concluded my prayer, he raised his own trembling hands to bless me. As he prayed over me in a disjointed mumble of words, the language made no sense yet I knew I was blessed by a true man of God, someone who allowed the radiance of God to shine. He was a priest to the very end, ministering more powerfully than ever even in the midst of his own brokenness.

We pray the light of heaven and eternal reward for Fr. Andy.


