Baroness Nuala O'Loan was the first Police Ombudsman in Northern Ireland. In 2009 she was made a member of the House of Lords and is the Chair of the Governing Council of the National University of Ireland, Maynooth.

Gerry O'Hanlon, S.J. was Professor of Systematic Theology in Milltown Institute. A former Provincial of the Jesuits in Ireland, he now works with the Jesuit Centre for Faith and Justice in Dublin.
