Issues for the Church – Issues for Us

• Hurricanes, landslides: repeated scandals & negative media coverage

 Arctic blasts, drought: limited relational engagement at pastoral level, lack of effective spiritual nourishment

• Environmental challenges: choosing maintenance over mission, preferring the comfort zone of doctrine & dogma to dialogue, language and communication

• Loss of Species/biodiversity: promoting uniformity over unity; rules & regulations over







Issues for the Church – Issues for Us

- Exploitation of resources: over reliance on volunteers, limited respect for time & labour, reluctance to invest in personnel
- Economic Imbalances: lack of meaningful engagement in Social Justice issues: homelessness, poverty, addiction, racism
- Democratic Deficit: Power/authority/decision making vested in small male minority








Bold Cultural Revolution (2018)




