Catholic Schools: Communities of Faith and Resilience

This short prayer service is based around the tree planted in the school grounds last year as part of the Catholic Schools Week Mass. It uses the symbols for the key daily themes for Catholic Schools Week 2021 – Faith, Learning, Love, Resilience, and Hope. These words need to be cut out, decorated and laminated, so they can be suspended from the trees branches or made into a mobile using wire coat hangers. The following picture symbols could be used instead: Faith – Cross; Learning - Book; Love – Heart; Resilience – Clenched Fist; Hope – Candle. A short prayer is then read by a student. When all five symbols are in place, pray the concluding prayer as an act of dedication or a school promise.

N.B. As schools are currently closed, teachers may want to use a small tree or plant of their own to represent the CSW tree planted on school grounds. The teacher can attach the words/symbols as a selected pupil reads the prayer during an online remote session.

The Love Symbol is put on the tree.

Student 4: Community of Resilience.

Lord, resilience means being strong and refusing to give up or give in no matter what we experience in life. Jesus was strong when people criticised Him unfairly and He continued always to do the will of His Heavenly Father. He showed incredible resilience when he faced His Passion and Death. Help us be resilient as we face our future together. Keep us from giving into temptations and depression. May we draw strength from Jesus, our true Master and Teacher. Help us to give courage and energy to one another always. We pray this in Jesus's Holy Name. Amen.

Student 5: Community of Hope

Together we pray: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.
